# ACT-SO HISTORY

The NAACP ACT-SO was founded in 1978 by author and journalist Vernon Jarrett. The program is intended to provide recognition to young people who could demonstrate academic, scientific, and artistic achievement. At the time, entertainers and athletes were holding the highest popularity among youth and Vernon Jarrett wanted to showcase intellectual talents of black youth through an "Olympics of the mind." ACT-SO is an acronym for Afro-Academic Cultural Technological Scientific Olympics. Almost 300,000 students have competed in ACT-SO since its inception. ACT-SO includes 33 different competition categories in the STEM, humanities, business, visual and performing arts and culinary arts.


